HOW TO APPLY

You can earn a PharmD in three years, with or without a bachelor’s degree, as long as you have completed at least 68 units in specific prerequisite courses. Since interview slots are limited, it is to your advantage to apply as early as possible. Apply early to receive priority review of your application and selection of scholarships.
